Class Changes

All the best, David Lomas Principal As a result of parent and teacher survey feedback conducted this year, we have decided to trial a new system for rewarding good behaviour, and tracking progress within our program, beginning in Term 3. This is a substantial change, and will take students, teachers, and families some time to adjust.

Why the Change?

The current system gives students green, orange or red days depending on their behaviour. Survey comments pointed to issues such as it affecting student self-esteem (in that it is somewhat of a pass/fail measure), and an increase in violence and outbursts when students reached 'red'. For example, if a student was 'red' by 11.00 in the morning, they felt their day was over and their behaviour escalated.

In terms of communication books, students were often not taking them home, or bringing them back, and in many cases destroying their books. Home schools have also not been filling them in consistently.

The New System

In Term 3 students will be given points for each session, and a total for each day. At the end of the week the points will be added up by the teacher, and Gold, Silver and Bronze awards given out accordingly for the total number of points. This means that if a student has a behaviour that in the past would have given them a 'red day', such as lashing out at a peer, they might not earn any points for that session, but will have the chance to earn 'full points' for the rest of the day if they settle (see example below).

Communication with home schools and families

Teachers will be asked to email parents and carers each Thursday with an update on how students are going. This will include highlights and positives, and may include if the student had a moment managing themselves.

IMPORTANT! – New Award System

The school would like to continue with Star Awards, however they will be given out at assembly for students to immediately take home (as in mainstream). As mentioned, each week students will receive a Gold for 90%, Silver for 80%, and Bronze for 70% behaviour for the week. **However, we would like to trial giving out vouchers for students to work towards, once they achieve a certain number of points.** The idea would be to use the currency that is common with young students, rather than the former (cheap) plastic items that have been given out historically. For example, vouchers for currency inside common video games such as Fortnite, Roblox, as well as Dymocks vouchers for books. They would most likely be around the \$10 price range.

Could you please get in touch with the school if you ethically object to monetised rewards for your child for good behaviour in our program as soon as possible, and we are also open to any other suggestions.




REMINDER
